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# HOW DID THESE GUYS \ MAKE THIS GUY?






The show's writers, David and Steve, were in an LA sublet, nervous about a TV meeting the next day. So, naturally, they decided to distract themselves by playing Mario Kart. Then, something magical happened. The game's opening music reminded them of **Neil Diamond**, and they wondered what a "long-lost Neil Diamond album" might sound like. They wrote a series of songs, pulling the lyrics from takeout menus. They loved the results. So. They turned them into this musical.

Also. They were both sad about being single so, again naturally, wrote the show to cheer themselves up. They say the show is "under the umbrella of truth," consisting of "a bunch of stories that are true" from their lives. They usually don't say what happened to whom, but they have mentioned that Steve getting robbed was a big inspiration.

Back in NYC with a rough draft in hand, they got an offer from the New York Musical Theatre Festival to put on the show if they could come up with funds to produce it. Actor John Ellison Conlee offered the money over drinks one night. Upon reading the script the next morning, **sober**, he doubled down and provided the seed money.

They used two bookshelves they found on the street in the set. Over the next ten years, David and Steve performed in the show and continued tweaking it until it reached its current form Off Broadway in 2018. And then several other productions happened. skip skip (actually, you can read about it in a couple pages). And now, here we are at CIRCLE THEATRE!





STEVE ROSEN recently wrote (with Gordon Greenberg) the stage musical adaptation of the Universal film *The Secret of My Success*, world-premiering at the Paramount Theater in February 2020. He and Greenberg have also written *Ebenezer Scrooge's BIG Christmas Show*, a comedic retelling of *A Christmas Carol* which has become a yearly tradition at the Bucks County Playhouse and The Old Globe. Rosen and Greenberg have also penned *Dracula: A Comedy of Terrors*, a farcical five-person comedic retelling of the classic horror story which premiered recently at the Maltz Jupiter Theater. Rosen has also worked extensively as a performer on stage and screen. He currently plays recurring roles on NBC's Law & Order: *SVU*, Fox's *The Resident* and has been nominated for a Drama Desk Award for his performance in *The Other Josh Cohen* as well as a Lucille Lortel Award for his performance in *Pretty Filthy* for The Civilians. He also originated principal roles in the original Broadway companies of *Monty Python's Spamalot*, Aaron Sorkin's *The Farnsworth Invention* and the 2009 revival of *Guys & Dolls*.

**DAVID ROSSMER** co-wrote *Rated P*, developed for television by Kelly Ripa's Milojo Productions and bought by ABC Studios. With Dan Lipton, Rossmer is writing the Broadway musical of Monopoly for Hasbro and The Araca Group, in collaboration with 3-time Tony Award nominee Rick Elice (Jersey Boys). Rossmer and Lipton also wrote the original Judd Apatow-esque comedy The Blonde Streak, the sci-fi musical Perfect Mate (commissioned by PCLO), and their form-bending satire JOE! is being developed as a TV show with Tootsie/Crazy Ex-Girlfriend star Santino Fontana. Their song "They Don't Let You in the Opera" is featured on Kelli O'Hara's Always album, and performed by the Tony winner across the country, including Library of Congress, Lincoln Center and Carnegie Hall. Her video performing with the Orlando Symphony went viral, garnering more than six million views. Rossmer was recently chosen as part of Audible's inaugural class of playwrights, for which he was commissioned by Amazon. As an actor, he has performed on Broadway in Les Miserables (Thernardier, recent revival), Peter and the Starcatcher (originated role of Teddy) and others, and can be seen recently on TV in The Good Fight, the final season of Elementary and the second season of Marvelous Mrs. Maisel.

DAVID ROSSMER & STEVE ROSEN co-wrote the book, music and lyrics for The Other Josh Cohen, a NY Times Critic's Pick nominated for six Drama Desk Awards (including Outstanding Musical, Book, Music and Lyrics) and a Lucille Lortel Award for Best Musical. The show began at NYMF, moved to a not-for-profit run at the Soho Playhouse, then on to sold-out runs at the 1,500 seat Paper Mill Playhouse, the Geva Theatre and most recently a critically acclaimed Off-Broadway commercial production at the Westside Theatre in NYC, twice extended. Rosen and Rossmer were recently hired to write the next chapter of the National Lampoon Vacation series — Broadway Vacation, a Broadway musical about the Griswolds in New York City. Rossmer and Rosen are co-creators, writers and hosts of the comedy improv variety show Don't Quit Your Night Job, which began at Joe's Pub at the Public Theatre and migrated to a successful commercial production Off-Broadway. For Don't Quit, Rosen and Rossmer wrote special material for the likes of Sting, Sutton Foster, Hank Azaria, David Hyde Pierce, Julianna Margulies and Lin-Manuel Miranda, to name a few. Their TV show Get In, Get Out is being developed by Radical Media.

There's a little bit of Josh Cohen in all of us. We have all experienced a loss of hope, a moment of desperation, and a time of being mad at the world around us. Enter our crew of players, who, over the next two hours will take you on a wild and hopeful journey. Each of them weaving in and out of Josh's experiences, body, and mind while telling this universal story in their own way.

Before even hitting page one of the script of *The Other Josh Cohen*, there is a note from the writers encouraging directors to approach the show with **freedom**, **curiosity**, and **a whole lot of playfulness**. There is no one way to approach *Josh Cohen*, in fact, there are "a million"—our writers advise us.

Digging into the script—full of **dozens of characters, wildly catchy tunes,** and **hilarious callbacks,** we find the writers did not exagerrate. In our production, we decided to approach the work with a **spirit of ensemble**, while we *all* explore the mind and wonderings of our dear Josh Cohen.

In this performance, you will see five actors **bend time and space** in order to tell this **fun** and **inspiring** little (big) story. You'll be treated to **belly laughs, big songs, absurd interactions, dynamic storytelling,** and **a heaping amount of that playfulness.** 

What stands out to me even more than the hope of our hero's journey in this piece, is the sense of **wonder** and **extreme joy** of storytelling throughout. The script is not only peppered with **comedy**, it leaves its players a responsibility to approach it with **whimsy, curiosity**, and **silliness**. Theatre is a place for **human stories** and **heart**, and through these avenues, we all get to **play** a little. **Make believe** is a **wonderful thing**, and building worlds through our art is an **extraordinary gift**.
