

She directed and adapted MacBeth which ran at Seattle Rep and off Broadway at the Lucille Lortel and HTP for which she received a Drama Desk nomination for Outstanding Direction and Outstanding Revival and a Lortel nomination for Outstanding Revival; MacBeth is now published by DPS. Schmidt wrote and directed All the Fine Boys for The New Group; now published by Samuel French. She directed Richard 2 with Robert Sean Leonard (The Old Globe); Turgenev's A Month In The Country with Taylor Schilling and Peter Dinklage (Classic Stage Company); Humor Abuse (co-creator/writer and director, Lucille Lortel Award - Manhattan Theatre Club, Philadelphia Theatre Company, American Conservatory Theatre, Seattle Rep and The Taper); Rent (Tokyo); Gary Mitchell's Trust (The Play Company, Callaway Award nomination); As You Like It (The Public Theater/NYSF, chashama; New York International Fringe Festival Winner for Best Direction); Debbie Does Dallas (wrote the adaptation and directed Off-Broadway for The Araca Group); Princess Grace Award recipient 2001. SHAKESPEARE'S WOMEN

Fem-Led Productions of *Mac B* Are Having a DAY.

We are thrilled to bring a whole new spin to William Shakespeare's horrifying classic *Macb*th*. (We try not to risk even the typing of the word.) We are seeing several adaptation of *The Scottish Play* (see below) but with a new flaire. A new wave of *Macb*th* adaptations written by female playwrights reimagine Shakespeare's classic through the lens of young women's experiences, ambition, and violence.

Jiehae Park's *Peerless* is a darkly comic and timely retelling set in a Midwestern high school, where twin Asian American sisters commit

murder to secure a spot at an elite college. The play critiques the college admissions race and the damaging effects of the model minority myth.

Sophie McIntosh's *Macbitches* explores toxic ambition and power dynamics within a college theatre department. When a freshman wins the role of Lady Macbeth, jealousy among peers escalates. The play draws parallels to #MeToo and examines how ambition in women is often dismissed as petty or selfish.

As for Erica Schmidt's adaptation of Mac Beth, well, you'll see that one today.

Across these adaptations, the playwrights reclaim and reshape the canon to reflect contemporary themes—challenging norms around race, gender, and authority. These productions don't shy away from violence, instead using it to interrogate how societal systems manipulate and marginalize young women. Playwrights and performers alike describe these works as empowering and necessary, offering representation and agency in a traditionally male-dominated literary landscape.

THE CURSE | AT A GLANCE

THE CURSE OF SAYING "MACB*TH" IN THE THEATER — EXPLAINED

THE SUPERSTITION:

Saying the word "Macb*th" inside a theater (except during rehearsals or performances) is considered bad luck. Instead, it's referred to as "The Scottish Play" "Mackers" "McB".

BELIEVED CONSEQUENCES SAYING "MACB*TH" IN A THEATER INCLUDE:

Actors to forgetting their lines, technical malfunctions, set pieces breaking, onstage injuries, even cancellations of the show

Why Is It Cursed?

Some believe Shakespeare used real witchcraft spells in the text, angering actual witches. Others point to a long history of real tragedies during productions, including: A real dagger being used accidentally onstage, actors being injured or even dying midrun, multiple fires and fights during early performances

Someone Said It - What Now?!

To break the curse, tradition says the person must:

(1) Leave the theater immediately, (2) Spin around three times, (3) Spit over their left shoulder, (4) Swear or say a Shakespearean curse word, (5) Knock and ask to be let back in

Yes, it's dramatic. But hey, it's theatre.


